This word can't be decoded using phonics so your child will have to learn it by sight. We have included It and The starting with a capital letter as they are often used at the start of sentences. Use 'it' and 'is' to make sentences with the character words - It is Kipper, It is Floppy etc We have also included a full stop with the keywords so they can use it to end their sentence.
Numeracy	Patterns Practise writing number 1, 2 and 3	 We have looked at repeating patterns using colours and shapes. They have looked at patterns in the environment. We have also looked at common 2D shapes naming them and making repeated patterns from them. At home - Look for patterns around the house. At home - Make patterns using colours Please go over 2Dshape

Handwriting	Pencil Grip Writing Name	 We have started practising writing their name using the cursive script this week. Your child was given their name at the beginning of term to practise. Encourage your child to hold a pencil correctly - use the thumb and second finger and rest the pencil on the hand. Use the cursive handwriting sheet given in the phonics pack to start writing the letters with the correct formation. Don't expect too much all in one go. Just concentrate on one letter in your child's name to begin with. If you find your child is not ready to write letters, encourage them to hold the pencil correctly and draw lines, squiggles, circles, zig-zags etc to improve his/her pencil control.
Other Information	 Please can you check all clothing is named as we still have jumpers/cardigans without a name. Please can we ask that your child brings a book bag only to school. We have very limited space in the book bag boxes/cloakroom and back packs take up too much room. They are checked every day by our teaching assistants and book bags are easier to open and check rather than searching zips and pockets in the back packs.
