

Home Activity Sheet – Week 9

Area	Activity	Examples
Sounds and Letters	Revise all phase 2 letter sounds Introduced j, v, w, x Phase 3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The children have been introduced to all the Phase 2 letter sounds and we will be revising the sounds and concentrating on 'blending' these sounds for reading and 'segmenting' the sounds for spelling. We have looked at double sounds ss, ff, ll, ck A letter sheet has been given out so your child can practice without picture clues. Make VC and CVC (V=vowel & C=consonant) words for your child to read. For example, it, on, peg, sit, man, tub, pot etc. Point to each letter in the word and say each sound. Say the sounds again getting faster. Stop when your child hears the word? Some children can blend easily and others need lots and lots of repetition. Ask your child to say the sounds and blend him/herself if he/she is ready for an extension.
Keywords	Learn keywords – get, got, him, has	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> See ideas on previous sheets Remember to keep revising all the keywords.
Literacy	"The Colour Monster" by Anna Llenas	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We have read the story The Colour Monster Looked at different feeling and how colour can be associated with a feeling ie blue for sad. Numeracy	Recognising numbers Practise writing number 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We have read the story of Spotty 7 and made a giraffe with 7 spots. Practised writing 7 Another part of our Maths this week was making Pudsey biscuits where they were encouraged to measure ingredients.
Topic	Our topic this week is Colour and Light but also Science Week "Plastic Pollution" Our focus this week has been Children in Need.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read the "Litter Queen" Read "The Rubbish Monster Thing" a monster who eats rubbish but when someone puts rubbish in the bin, he starts to disappear. A story saying how important it is to throw rubbish in the bin Looked at the importance of recycling Read "Duffys Lucky Escape" about a turtle who ate plastic We have talked about the Children in Need charity, talking about what people do to raise money, who the money helps and what we will be doing to raise money. Some of the other things we have done this week include making Pudsey biscuits, Pudsey chocolates, Pudsey hats and ears and lots of Pudsey activities We have also danced and sang the Children in Need song
