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# Values- Term 3

During term 3, our new value will be 'Responsibility'.

Responsibility is a key value and as parents and teachers, we play an important role in helping our children become responsible — interpersonally, personally, at home, and in the local and global community. Children need to develop a sense of responsibility to be prepared for adult living. Teaching responsibility can begin when they are young and is one of the best values for children to possess. Cooperating with and helping others can be an important way for children to learn responsibility. We can help children develop and improve their cooperative attitudes by giving them tasks that are challenging, satisfying and appropriate for their level of development. Children benefit when they feel that they are doing a real job and making a contribution, at home, at school, in the local community and further afield.



Increasingly as children grow up they also need to understand that they are responsible for the choices they make and the actions they take. Very young children know the difference between something which is right and something which is wrong. We need to encourage and support children to make the right choices, developing a sense of responsibility. "Being responsible means that we do the right thing even when no one is looking. We do the right thing because it is right and not because we will get credit or praise for doing it." West Virginia University

Please support the school by discussing this value with your child so that they can share their perspective. It is wonderful to see children really listening to and learning from each other's thoughts and experiences. Through Assemblies, circle time and PHSE lessons we will be exploring and developing this value with the children. May I also encourage you to send in any anecdotes about 'Responsibility' being shown at home or in the community so your child can share with their class. We can really see 'Responsibility' being demonstrated throughout the school.
