Welcome to our Term 4 newsletter. It's lovely to know that Spring is just around the corner and that we can start to look forward to the longer days and lighter evenings.

During Term 3, as part of our school values, we looked at Responsibility and how we all need to try to make the right choices and take responsibility for that choice. We also looked at the different types of responsibility from caring for our families to caring for our world. We also focused on ensuring that we take responsibility to wear the correct uniform to school thinking also about hairstyles and the correct footwear. Every class has had an action packed drama session with a teacher from Perform UK, focussing on a book that the class had already read or is currently reading. The sessions brought the books to life through drama, dancing and singing, with lots of fun and laughter mixed in. The buzz created in this session, spilled over into their follow up work and writing, back in the classroom.



Classes paired up so that the older children could read and share books with the younger children in the school. These were such lovely sessions as the children were completely engaged in the enjoyment of reading.

The children LOVED this experience and were keen to get started on reading their books as soon as they went back to the classroom.
