Following on from the October newsletter you are all aware that we are focusing this year on values. Strong values are extremely important to everyone at Great Chart Primary School: pupils, staff, governors etc. This term our Value will be:

Aspiration

Aspiration is linked to self-belief and is a concept which is becoming increasingly recognised as a key factor in learning and future success in life – To have this, children must have a positive growth mind-set. We will also be investigating other areas related to aspiration- Success, Effort, Determination, Commitment, Drive, Enthusiasm, Optimism and Hope.



This is a phrase I'm sure many of you have heard when watching the news. Schools have a huge task of trying to ensure children catch up. We have been really fortunate with the support parents have given and continue to give their children during this time. During the lockdown, Google classroom and keeping learning going was extremely effective. However, we still have a lot to do to ensure we give children as many opportunities to reinforce and embed their learning. We are doing this through a number of strategies:

- Our recovery curriculum focusing on key issues
- ♦ Extras tuition session for pupils in KS2
- Introducing a new Phonics package to support staff tracking progress and identifying next steps
- Language programme being used in EYFS
- ♦ Y5 being split across 3 groups for English and Maths
- ♦ Y4 being split across 3 groups for English and Maths- planning for this from Term 3



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
