The children have all settled back into Great Chart School life really well. During our Induction days at the beginning of term we spent a lot of time reinforcing our values and behaviour expectations. The children fully understand our rules and subsequent rewards and consequences. We have also been discussing with the children Self Regulation as part of this which will be discussed later in this newsletter.

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This term's value is respect: respect for each other and also respect for our beautiful school and its premises. We want our school to be enjoyed by us and many others in the future.

We have stressed with the children how hard everyone works in the school including our Site Managers. During our first 'Whole' School Assembly I spoke to the children about all the changes the Site Managers had to manage over the 6 weeks. They didn't have a break! It was lovely to hear how grateful the children and staff were of the efforts which had been made. Please could I thank the Site Managers and our cleaners for all their hard work over the holidays to ensure our school carries on being maintained to such a high standard. Well done Mr Roberts, Mr Beck and the cleaners.

Parent/teacher consultations will be happening during November. We are hoping to carry out these face to face so that teachers can meet parents. For our second set of consultations in March we will possibly hold these virtually, however all of this is subject to change. Information on how we will be doing this will be sent out later this month. Please could I remind parents that it is extremely important that you attend these meetings. Parental support is essential if children are to progress at school particularly. Teachers will inform you of progress which is being made and what help you can give to your child at home.



Strong values are extremely important to everyone at Great Chart Primary School: pupils, staff, governors etc. A <u>value</u> is a <u>principle</u> that <u>guides</u> our <u>thinking</u> and <u>behaviour</u>. We will aim to promote an educational philosophy based on valuing self, others and the environment. Adults will model values and give children the time for reflection that will empower them to be effective learners and good citizens.



Our value for Term 1 will be Respect. This value is at the core of everything we do in school. It underpins learning through behaviour and one's attitude to the people and the world around them. We are extremely lucky that our school community (staff, children, parents, governors) is a very positive, supportive and respectful one.

Along with this value we will also be focusing on the following words and exploring what they mean to us:

Honesty Manners Equality Valuing people for who they are Loyalty Understanding Consideration



This is our behaviour system within school. All the children understand our school rules and are now trying hard, with the support of staff, to remain on green, by making the right choices. This system works as follows:

All children start each session on green

If they fail to follow the rules they will be given a warning. Failing to follow the rules a second time will mean they move their name to amber and 5 minutes will be taken off their playtime.

Failing to follow the rules further will result in their name being moved to red. This will mean all their playtime will be missed (apart from a comfort break) and the teacher will inform parents.

If a child is violent, threatening to anyone or disrespectful to an adult they will go straight to purple. The teacher and a member of the Senior Leadership or Management Team will meet with parents to discuss a way forward to ensure the school rules are followed.

This is a very simple system to be used throughout the school which will be monitored very closely and now forms part of our behaviour policy which can be viewed on the website. We will of course reward those pupils who consistently follow the school rules and 'stay on green'.



Starting School Information Sessions



Children born between 1 September 2017 and 31 August 2018 will start school in Autumn 2022. There will be guided tours (last tour being at 5.00pm) of the school and lots of information about school life at Great Chart. Parents will have a chance to speak to our admissions team and senior members of staff and governors.



Bikeability Years 5 & 6





Well, it has been an exciting start to the year for years 5 and 6 with pupils having the opportunity to develop their cycling through Bikeability training delivered by Cycle Circle.

The year 5 pupils covered Level 1 skills on the playground. This included starting and stopping under control, turning, sharing the space, signalling, using gears and awareness of conditions and others. They all made progress and we hope to offer them the opportunity to take the Level 2 training in term 6.

Year 6 pupils participated in the Level 2 training that started on the playground and progressed onto the roads. This also included junctions, signalling, road position, control and observation.

Year 6 pupils who have completed Level 2 training are now able to cycle to school if they wish and use the new cycle storage on the KS2 playground.

As well as the training, pupils were also invited to join an after school guided ride with the instructors. A group of pupils were out for around an hour and a half putting their skills into practise and had a great time exploring local routes.

Cycle Circle also offer family Bikeability training and some of our families have taken this opportunity to arrange some training as a family so they can enjoy cycling together. There will be further cycle training later this school year so watch this space!
